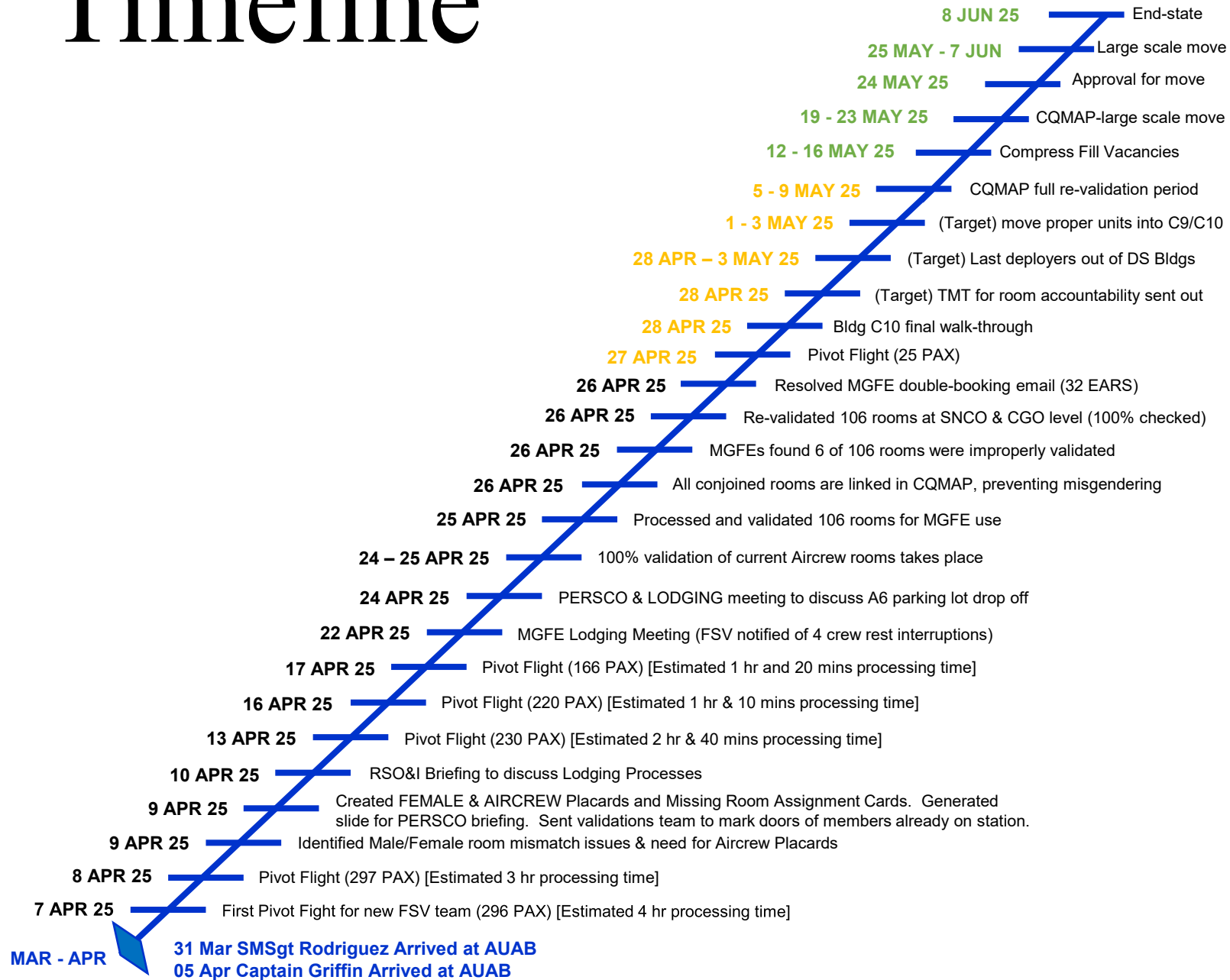

Lodging Q&As

1. What policies are needed to manage unit-based lodging?

Answer: Update the current policy to reflect the following:

- Assignment based on duration, unit, and rank.
- Rotation policies for deployments.
- Clear rules for inspections and maintenance.
- Mechanisms for grievances and lodging standard enforcement.

2. How do we measure success after implementation?

Answer: Through surveys (quality of life, morale), incident rates (disciplinary issues tied to living conditions), and operational readiness metrics linked to unit performance (Zero percent aircrew rest interruption).

3. What challenges might arise, and how can they be mitigated?

Answer: Resistance from members used to current lodging systems. The way to mitigate is strong communication, working groups (RSOI), partnerships (ECES, ECONS, & ECS), pilot programs, and gradual rollout. Additional challenges are the lack of availability of rooms. C10 is coming available soon to alleviate shortage. The next pivot, 25.2 members will transfer to the double stacks to alleviate lodging issues. A plan must be developed to utilize tenant units rooms in case of an emergency surge.

4. What is the timeline to remove 25.2 deployed members from double-stack to permanent rooms?

Answer: Between the dates of 28 April – 3 May 2025.

5. How will Lodging ensure uninterrupted crew rest?

Answer: Lodging has partnered with A3/A5 to resolve this issue by blocking rooms and pre-allocating keys for aircrew, ensuring a smooth transition to accommodations. A3/A5 will confirm that the rooms are ready to prevent interruptions to crew rest breaks. Although distributing keys in advance is not standard for regular units, it is necessary for these smaller units as we improve our internal room tracking.

6. How will Lodging ensure room gender assignments are compatible?

Answer: CQMAP, the lodging system, is undergoing updates to establish identical-gender spaces. Until this process is complete, clear signs designating gender will be in place. It is essential to respect these designations and refrain from entering spaces that do not align with your identified gender.

7. How will SSOT be updated so that customers, ULRs, Command Teams, etc. can easily find information?

Answer: EFSS will update necessary policy and business rule documents and will revamp the SSOT Lodging tab for a more user-friendly experience.
